

"PETUNIAS"

The authentic perfume of New Orleans on Washington Avenue

One of the fine qualities of "Petunia's" is the service. No hassle, no bullshit, no "I'm Ken, your waiter for tonight, but I'm really and actor" stuff. David Osborn is the consummate professional, while having fun, he's efficient. That by itself should be enough to drag you through the door.

First of all, I must confess I love Cajun food, the spicier the better. Four of the five in my party, however, didn't share my passion for hot spices, and for

them, everything was seasoned just right.

We started with appetizers of Gumbo, Bar-b-que shrimp, Cajun crab fritters, Cajun grilled chicken fingers and Baked oysters. One favorite was the crab fritters, another, the oysters, hands down. All were really delicious, but I couldn't pick really pick one over the other, they were all so good. The consensus at the table was that everything was really great - except for the chicken fingers. They were tasty enough, just a little less interesting than the other appetizers served.

This was followed by the house salad, with a choice of dressing, the most imaginative dressing being the creamy peppercorn (not too spicy). The salad is included with the entree, but you can substitute the salad for gumbo (for \$1.50 more), pretty reasonable.


Next, the entrees. We feasted on Cajun grilled catfish, Jambalaya, Shrimp Creole, Cajun Pasta and Cajun Chicken. The jambalya was my favorite, the Cajun Pasta was the yummiest, and we all went crazy over the catfish. Once again, the chicken was O.K., but lost among the color, sight and aroma of the other dishes.

Trace Joyce, the fabulous chef, was kind enough to make me a special hot sauce on the side. It was so good, I asked for, and he gave me the ingredients: a little cream, Tabasco & Crystal hot sauce, Worcestershire sauce, fresh horseradish, garlic and cayenne pepper. It was amazing, very hot, while are still letting the flavors of the food come through.

For those unfamiliar with the ingredients of jambalya, its basically a onepot Cajun dish of shrimp, sausage, veggies, seasoning and rice, kind of stewed, so the flavors intermingle. The gumbo is similar in its cooking method, but has shrimp and crab meat as its main ingredients.

We were so full after all that great food, so we split dessert, a "Bananas Foster Crepe". This New Orleans classic is an orgasmic mixture of vanilla ice-cream and bananas, sautéed with brown sugar, rum and vanilla. This was big enough for all of us to try, and perfect to split between two people.

When "Petunia's" first opened, I ate there a couple of times, times. While the food was good, it seemed far too pricey for us locals. The prices are now much more realistic, while the food seems twice as good. If you tried "Petunia's" when it first opened, go back for



another shot. If you've not tried "Petunia's", check it out. There are so many mediocre restaurants on South Beach, that one is unlikely to try a restaurant without a recommendation. I highly recommend "Petunia's", and know you'll enjoy it.

"Petunia's" is located at 1321 Washington Ave, ph.534-6883. They have an extensive lunch menu with specials; it's a little different from the dinner menu. Hours of operation are from noon till 11:00pm during the week, and on weekends, they open at noon and close at midnight.
