Florida Aids Ride Presented by Tanqueray expects 900 bicyclists to make the three-day, 275 mile course from Orlando to Miami, beginning May 17.

This is a ride, not a race, with each rider travelling at their own pace. As they travel down the coast, riders will be fully supported by catered hot meals, five daily water and snack stops, hot showers, medical and mechanical services, and tents for camping.

This is a huge undertaking, being produced by Daniel Pallotta, the Executive Producer and creator of the AIDS Ride. The AIDS Ride "mobile city" which supports not only the 900 riders, but also hundreds of volunteers includes 65 support vehicles and 750 tents. This "mobile city" travels with the riders and is set up every day before the riders arrive at camp, and torn down every morning after the riders leave for that day's trip.

The Florida AIDS Ride is being held in conjunction with the California AIDS Ride and Boston to New York AIDS Ride. The first Boston to New York AIDS Ride took place in Septiber 1995. The three-day, 250 mile ride included almost 4,000 participants from 29 states and countries and raised \$6.5 million, making it the highest grossing AIDS fund-raiser in the world

Pallotta commented recently that "the Rides are demanding and challenging. That's why p ple are doing them. Given the scope of the AIDS epidemic, things that are easy just don't meas up anymore...This affects us all in some way. This is our time to be heroes."

We can all participate. The riders of this First Ever Florida AIDS Ride will be arriving 4:00p.m. on Sunday, May 19th at Flamingo Park. Their arrival will be celebrated in fine style, you can make a donation there, too. For further info call 532-6055.


